The Role of the CASA Volunteer





What is the role of a CASA volunteer?

- Establish a relationship with a child in foster care, visit the child a minimum of two times a month, and perform advocacy-related tasks.
- Provide the court with information about the child's needs, wishes, strengths and best interest.
- Facilitate communication and promote collaboration between assigned professionals including social workers, therapists, schools, caregivers, and other team members.
- Identify resources within the community to meet the child's needs.

How do CASA volunteers help?

- Serve as a positive role model who will listen to and provide consistent support while the child is in the foster care system.
- Be a voice for the child in the court room, classroom and community.
- Ensure the child's unique needs are identified and met.
- Support caregivers in identifying enrichment, extra-curricular, or additional community activities and resources.



What a CASA volunteer does not do:

- Provide transportation to or from appointments.
- Provide babysitting or respite care.
- Provide legal advice.
- Provide therapeutic services.



Please notify the CASA volunteer if:

- The child has food allergies, sensitivities, or dietary restrictions.
- Any significant changes in the child's health or behavior.
